Class History

On August 29, 1964, 256 freshmen entered the halls of Scott High School. They were guided by Louise Rees, William Bowles, Readith Doss, Virginia Bond, Tom Burner, Gaye Brown, Elvin Covert, and John Myers. They selected as leaders; A. Jay Hatfield, President; Joe Ball, Vice-President; Janie Tolliver, Secretary and Treasurer; Linda Nicholas, Historian. We chose as our colors blue and white. "ANYTHING WORTH BEGINNING IS WORTH FINISHING," was chosen as the motto. The white carnation was selected as the flower, representing our class.

Janie Tolliver, head; Linda Nicholas, co-head; Linda Brown, Faye Stone, and Lou Ann Copley, alternate, were picked as Freshman cheerleaders.

Homecoming was October 16. It was a victory with Scott beating Hamlin 6-0.

The next year only 232 sophomores returned. Our sponsors were Louise Rees, William Bowles, Robert Roush, Virginia Bond, Elvin Covert, Gaye Brown, and Evelyn Lambert. Our class officers were Eddie Hill, President; Janie Tolliver, Vice-President; Rebecca Roush, Secretary and Treasurer; Deanna Workman, Historian. A. Jay Hatfield was chosen as Vice-President of the Student Council.

Homecoming was September 24, Scott beat Hurricane 6-0. The theme of our float was "We're Expecting a Victory," and placed second.

The Junior Varsity cheerleaders were Susan Webb, head; Brenda Chaffin, co-head; Deanna Workman, and Lou Ann Copley, alternate. Janie Tolliver and Brenda Smith were chosen Varsity cheerleaders.

Sandy Gibson, Priscilla Garrett and Sherry Chewning were picked as majorettes.

On June 4, the sophomore class sponsored a Hawaiian style dance featuring the King's Knights.

At the beginning of our junior year there were 200 juniors. Our sponsors were Louise Rees, William Bowles, Elvin Covert, Virginia Bond, Robert Roush, Gaye Brown, Grover Weaver, and Terry Chambers.

Eddie Hill was chosen as Vice-President of the Student Council.

Those returning to our cheering squad were Janie Tolliver, Deanna Workman and Brenda Chaffin as Varsity cheerleaders.

Sandy Gibson, co-head; Priscilla Garrett, and Sherry Chewning were chosen as majorettes.

This year our homecoming was not a victory. We were beaten by Barboursville with a score of 53 to 6.

On the magazine drive for 1966-67 we really topped our goal when we made \$2,100.

Ellen Hanlon and James Bias represented our class on "Know Your State Government Day".

With Readith Doss and Gaye Brown as the directors, our junior play entitled "Mail Order Mary," was a big success. The play cast was Phil Kingery, Severn White, Rita Halstead, Linda Brown, David Hill, Becky Roush, Roger Burdette, Kenneth Stollings, Faye Stone and Diana Lucas.

As a big victory, the juniors won the Girl's Basketball Tournament.

Those inducted into the National Honor Society on the basis of leadership, scholarship, character, and service were: Sandy Gibson, Ellen Hanlon, Severn White, Mary Cline, Jeannie Miller, James Bias, John Walker, Barbara Matthews, Chester Adkins, Teresa Agosti, Laverne Long, and Carol Dolin.

The prom on May 12 with the theme "Moonlight and Roses" was the highlight of the year. We were entertained by the Esquires.

As the final year arrived, only 193 of the original class of 1968 enrolled as seniors. Our faithful sponsors were William Bowles, Virginia Bond, Gaye Brown, E. D. Hill, Elvin Covert, Grover Weaver, and Bernard Marcinek. Our senior officers elected were: John Walker, President; Mike Dunlap, Vice-President; Judy Bias, Secretary; Lou Ann Copley, Treasurer; Deanna Workman, Historian.

Once again chosen as Varsity cheerleaders were Janie Tolliver, head; and Brenda Chaffin.

Our majorettes were Sandy Gibson acting as head, with Priscilla Garrett and Sherry Chewning as co-heads.

On October 6, 1967, we had a big victory when Scott beat Seth 30-0. Deanna Workman was crowned Miss Skyhawk with Judy Bias and Barbara Matthews as her attendants.

The senior play, "The Honeymoon Is Over," directed by Virginia Bond and Gaye Brown, was presented on November 30 and December 1. The cast included: Judy Bias, Danny Brady, Roger Burdette, Edna Heater, Phillip Kingery, Jeannie Miller, Becky Roush, and Kenneth Stollings.

Our final step in achieving our goal was on June 4, graduation day.

Now that we have reached our destination, it can be well worth saying "ANYTHING WORTH BEGINNING IS WORTH FINISHING".

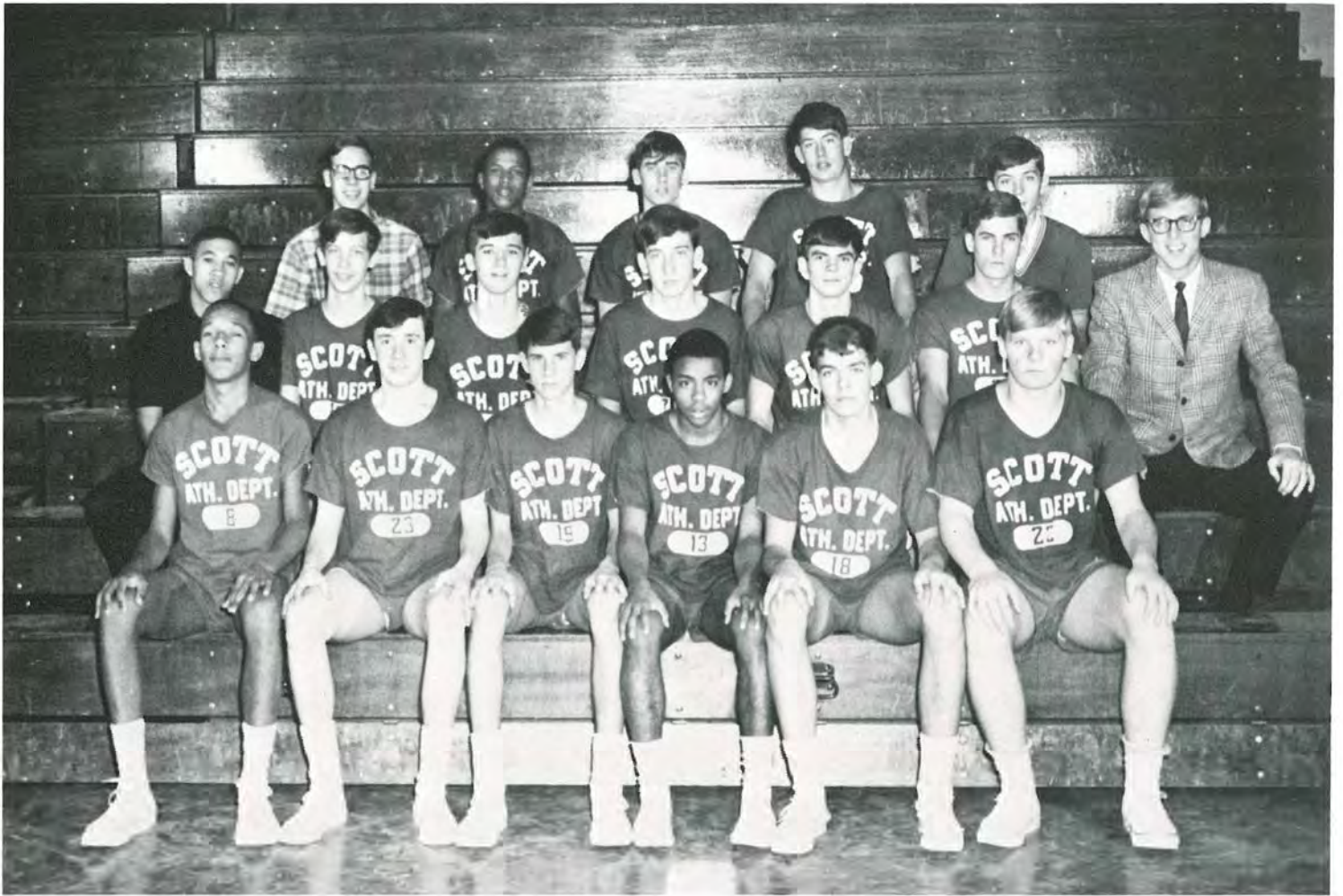

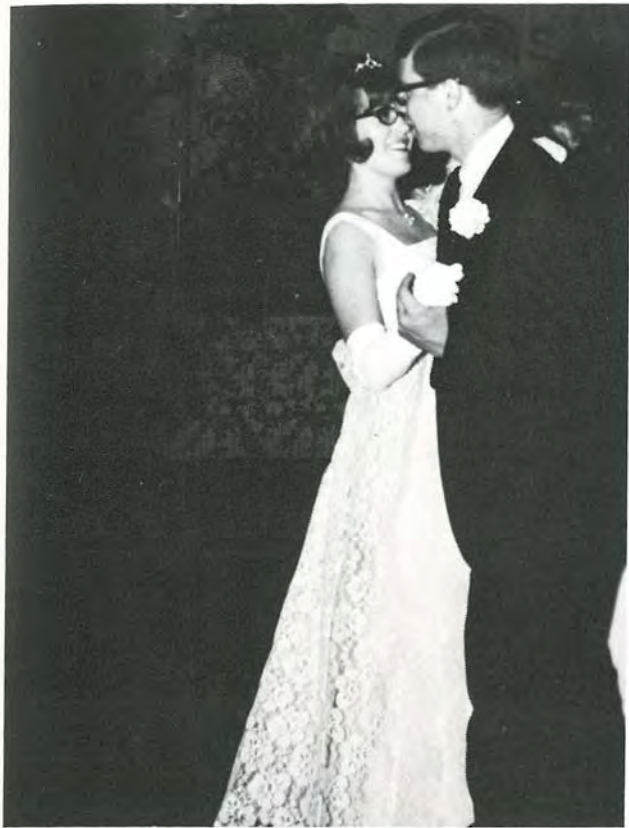
